GENERAL INFORMATION

ADMISSIONS/ELIGIBILITY:

Classes are open to all adult students 18 years of age of older, regardless of residency or citizenship.

CHILDREN:

Children under 18 years old are not permitted in any Adult Education class.

CLASS CANCELLATION POLICY:

Students must attend the first class session in order to establish the class. Fees are based on a minimum number of students. Classes may be cancelled, hours reduced, or fees increased if we do not have the minimum number of students enrolled for all daytime and evening classes.

REFUND POLICY:

Refunds will ONLY be given if the class is cancelled by the adult education office. If a class is cancelled due to insufficient enrollment, a full refund will be given. If you are unable to attend a class, you must notify us 48 hours in advance to receive a refund. A minimum enrollment is required for each class. Refund checks will be mailed only to the registered party or individual who made the payment and may take 4-6 weeks for processing. Please select your classes carefully as there are no refunds after the first class meeting if you were in attendance or not. No refunds for books or supplies.




